

Helicobacter pylori Serology Testing Update

Effective October 1, 2023

Discontinuation of Helicobacter pylori (H. pylori) Serology Testing

WHO: All customers of Wisconsin Diagnostic Laboratories (WDL)

WHAT: In our current efforts to align test offerings with current guidelines and recommendations, on October 1, 2023, WDL will discontinue offering serological (IgA, IgG, and IgM) testing for *Helicobacter pylori* (*H. pylori*).

The use of serologic testing for *H. pylori* is not recommended due to limited clinical utility and low positive predictive value (PPV). Antibodies to *H.pylori* remain detectable for years following resolution of infection, and while a negative result suggests the absence of prior *H. pylori* infection, serologic testing cannot be used to distinguish active from past infection or to document eradication of the organism following successful treatment. Additionally, increasing numbers of health insurance providers no longer reimburse *H. pylori* serologic testing as they consider such testing medically unnecessary.

The following tests are available for diagnosing active H. pylori infection:
